# Monthly Reflection by Chaplain Aram Our "Ministry Philosophy" here at The Gardens

Occasionally I hear comments, both direct and indirect, about the spiritual and other activities here: the music, the liturgy, performances, etc. For example, last week I received a phone call from a professional musical group we once had here to perform a concert. They proceeded to tell me that they had since attended our Mass, and wanted to come in and offer their services. After talking a bit, I discerned that their goal was to "professionalize" it, which in their mind, would be an "upgrade" to what we currently have. They spoke of the music, and also upgrading the lectors to having professionally trained readers from the outside. As soon as I realized where they were heading, and what they were proposing, and (more importantly) the spirit behind it, I said "thanks but no thanks" and ended the call. For me, they didn't have the right heart, and the right spirit. They emphasized professionalism and excellence, but it was at the expense of relationship and participation. I want you to know that I'm all for excellence. We are privileged to have in amazing groups and people like the Vittoria Ensemble, the WillowBirch Duo (Julie Plouffe & Katy Wherry), and many others that Jeanelle has brought in to do concerts and performances. And as we look ahead, I'm already lining up some incredible organists to do recitals, like Phil Bordeleau from the Cathedral, and Norm Sutfin (Trinity United Methodist Church) is also on my radar. #### The Mystery of St. Valentine



The Catholic Church recognizes several saints named Valentine, making the identity of the patron saint of lovers a matter of historical debate. No single definitive account exists. The most common association links St. Valentine to a priest in Rome during the 3rd century AD, under the reign of Emperor Claudius II. Claudius, believing unmarried men made better soldiers, outlawed

marriage for young men. Legend claims Valentine defied this decree, secretly performing marriages for young couples. His defiance allegedly led to his imprisonment and subsequent execution, likely sometime around 270 AD.
