

But they can also be dangerous if the driver is not fully trained on safety with maneuverability and proper use of the chairs functionality. The Occupational Therapy Department here at St Clare Commons offers this training which is mandatory for use of these devices throughout our campus.

Insurance, if in network, often covers this education. If you are thinking about purchasing a power wheelchair or scooter this training must be completed prior to use in our facility for the protection of the driver, our residents, guests and staff members.
