Please note these items are not permitted at St. Clare Commons:

- Space heaters
- Heated blankets
- Toaster ovens
- CANDLEWARMERS
- Glade plug in type devices
- If a candle is found, the wick needs removed
- Extension cords, residents may have surge protectors if no medical equipment is plugged into it, and must be six feet away from bed
- Live Christmas trees
- Christmas lights must be UL listed, recommend battery powered lights as safest option.

In general anything that has a heated element should not be allowed.
